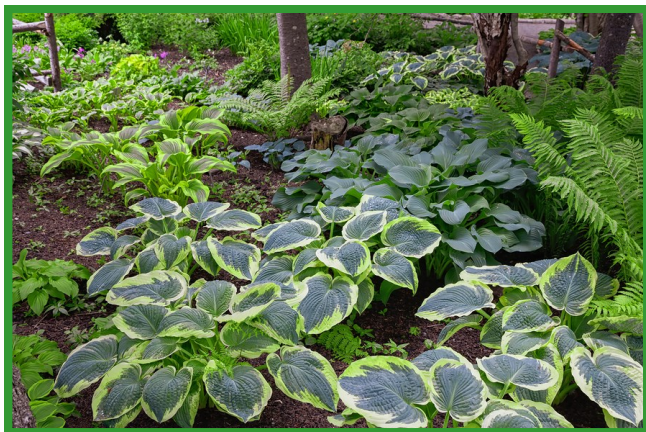


Adult Education Classes | Summer 2019
